

Advent – the period of four weeks leading up to Christmas – marks the beginning of the church year. It seems like an odd time of year to think of beginnings. The last leaves have fallen from the trees. It is hard to remember a time when it was light when we got up in the morning, and the winter stretches ahead in apparently endless months of darkness and cold.

And yet even at this time of year there are signs of life in the world around. The yellow stars of winter jasmine flowers glimmer against stone walls. The white and pink cyclamen huddle in the leaf mould under the bare trees. Clusters of tiny white or pink flowers sprig the evergreen gloss of the viburnum leaves.

Through Advent we prepare to remember a time when God touched a world shrouded in darkness, despair and gloom. When we look closely at a humble inn in a small town in the outer reaches of the Roman empire, we find the bright light of the gift of God's son, Jesus, shining in the darkness. That birth promised the beginning of a new hope not only for Israel but for the whole world.

We have a particularly special beginning to look forward to in Brancepeth in the coming year. At some point in the spring, when the signs of new life are all around us, we will be welcoming a new priest-in-charge to our village. We are delighted to be able to announce that Anna Brooker will be moving in to the rectory, alongside her husband, Nick. For the last few years Anna has been looking after the parishes of Shotton Colliery, Haswell and South Hetton. We hope in the January edition to be able to give exact details of the timing of her installation and licensing at St Brandon's.

I am sure that you will join with us in providing a warm Brancepeth welcome to Anna and Nick as they settle in. In the meantime, on behalf of all at St Brandon's, I wish you a very merry Christmas and happy new year.
