

Dear Friends,

We are not a household that throws things away very much, though we try! So I was not surprised when a copy of the newsletter from June 2006 dropped out from behind somewhere. What amused me was the cover letter, written by Sue Morgan, as a then member of the Shared Ministry Development Team (SMDT) reporting on the anticipated appointment of a new Priest-in-Charge (Rick, as it transpired). Sue wrote:

"The big difference now of course is that we are a Shared Ministry Parish. A priest coming into this parish would not expect to 'take over' but to work as part of the team. What perhaps we should hope for is someone who is in a position to help promote the wider aims of the parish to develop the role of this church as a venue for more varied and regular usage."

And here we are again, nearly 13 years later anticipating the arrival of a new Priest-in-Charge (Rev Anna Brooker). What's changed in that time? Surprisingly little if we look at the names on committees: six of the eight members of the 2006 SMDT are currently on a church committee (the missing two being Marion and Margaret). If we look across all the church committees of 2006, only one of those listed has since left Brancepeth, and if we include all the parish committees as well, so now all the names on the inside front and back cover, only four have since left. This is a stable community, and one where people remain in harness!

Looked at that way, to the outside eye, it can feel little has changed: we were in much the same looking building as now, run by much the same committees. However, that's because we were nearly at the summit of a really hard climb, we had been in vacancy for over two years, and difficult years during which we largely completed re-build, and re-entered our church building. We had grown a lot in that challenging period and were about to celebrate the achievement with a three-day flower festival culminating in a service to be led by Bishop Tom Wright. It was an enormous achievement and many of us were very deeply tired from the climb.

Superficially, to the outside observer, it might not appear much has changed since then but inside and underneath, a tremendous amount of growth and consolidation of learning has happened since Rick joined us in 2006. Under his leadership, and inspired by his worship-leading, we have a strong, established pattern of how we work together in governance, in prayer, in pastoral care - and partying! We are about as un-fractured as we can manage as a congregation, and therefore well able to welcome and nurture. We have grown in number and age-range (don't overlook Messy Church) and openness about our faith. We have been able to carry this twelve months of vacancy with confidence and with a large number from our congregation leading worship in every aspect: true team ministry. We are strong, we are ready for new growth and open to change for the positive, as God may ask of us, and we look forward in eager anticipation to welcoming in 'The Anna Era'.

A visiting preacher charged us with contemplating, as we wait, what we hope for Anna to bring, what might we discern God's preferred direction of travel be for us?

John Grubb Morgan RIP 24/09/44 - 03/01/19

An extract from the Eulogy given at John's funeral service on 17th January at St.Brandon's Church:

John had some very clear loves and principles in his life that clearly defined him: his love for his family both near and far; the friendships formed throughout his life; his art and pottery; his teaching; his concern for the environment; his vegetarianism; his craftsmanship and drive to restore all things old to their former glory; and his love of this village and life within it.

John was born in Labrador, Canada, where he lived for six of his first 7 years. His father was a Moravian Missionary, working among the Inuit peoples, and his mother a school teacher. John remembered travelling by dog sleigh with his father; and he learnt early that when things broke down they needed to be repaired rather than replaced with new, and often with very limited access to spare parts. Ingenuity, skill and determination were essential for life.

Between the ages of 7 and 14 years, John lived with his aunt and three cousins in Weardale until his parents returned permanently to Howden-le-Wear. He studied at Wolsingham Grammar before completing a teacher training course at Northumberland College of Education. After a year teaching in Newcastle, John took up a post at Brandon Secondary School as an art teacher. Subsequently the school merged with Durham Johnson Comprehensive school where John spent almost 25 years teaching art up to both GCSE ordinary and advanced level. Sue has received many fond tributes from John's former pupils, grateful for the inspiration and encouragement he gave them towards developing successful careers in art.

Within his own art work John was always trying different methods and mediums. Initially working in oils, his painting moved through the use of chalks and pastels, until finally working with watercolours. His great love was his pots; experimenting with different clays and designs, developing his own glazes, and always testing how tall or how thin he could make them. Some of his finest work was in porcelain which is regarded as the most difficult form of pottery to master. At his funeral there was a fine range of his work on display in the church.

John moved into Durham Road, Brancepeth in 1975, where Sue joined him in on their marriage in 1978, and the family moved to Peppermires in1991. John was always willing to help other people, always doing jobs, particularly in Church and in the village hall. He was renowned for his Christmas decorations again both in Church and the Village Hall. He loved this village and played a very active part in it; and through his involvement in the Church, Community Association Management Committee, Parish Council, Allotment Association, Archive & History group, quiz nights, badminton, ceildhis, yoga, and the art classes that he ran, he probably knew and was known by more people in this village and parish than any other person!

During his early years in Brancepeth John studied for an Open University Degree and chose History of Art & Architecture for his honours degree options. He put this knowledge, together with his practical skills, to good use in the renovation of no less than four houses in Brancepeth! He paid enormous attention to detail in the methods and materials he used in restoring these properties.

John achieved much in his life, but for us here in St Brandon's, he will always be remembered for the crucifix which looks over us. Created from charred wood after the great fire in 1998 it has been a sign of hope and rebirth; and it has truly taken its place in the rich history of 900 years of Christian witness in this place.

Above all, John lived for his family; Sue, James and Cat, and the birth of his grandson Paul in October brought him much joy at such a difficult time in his life.
