

Happy March to you all,

I wonder if you are looking forward to the end of March with dread or with excitement. Well, more than enough words have been written about that subject so I am going to steer well clear of it.

However it seems to me that March has much else to interest us.

March is named after Mars, the Roman God of war. Not a very auspicious start. However the birth flower of those born in March is the daffodil. That seems rather more encouraging.

So what else does March have to offer?

Well March 1<sup>st</sup> is the meteorological beginning of spring. 20<sup>th</sup> or 21<sup>st</sup> March is the equinox that marks the astronomic beginning of spring. Either way, March seems to signal that spring is in the air. Good news!

5<sup>th</sup> March this year is Shrove Tuesday; the day before Ash Wednesday. It is chiefly marked by feasting and celebration, which traditionally precedes the observance of the Lenten fast. We love pancakes!

6<sup>th</sup> March this year is Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday is marked 46 days before Easter Sunday. It is the first day of Lent – which is the period of self-restraint and abstention for Christians prior to Easter. It marks the first day of fasting, repentance, prayer and self-control. We will be holding a service in church that evening and hope many of you will come.

17 March is of course St. Patrick's Day. Patrick being of course Ireland's patron saint. My Irish grandchildren celebrate that day with great gusto. If I am honest, I'll be more excited that it is, this year, the first day of the F1 calendar; with the first race being held in Australia.

25 March is the birthday of one of my granddaughters. Maybe some of you have a March birthday too. I was also nearly a March baby but must have been a bit lazy.

31<sup>st</sup> March we will be celebrating Mothering Sunday-see elsewhere in the Newsletter for more info about that. But we do hope to see lots of you in church that day too.

But what I really like about the end of March, 31<sup>st</sup> this year, is that we will change the clocks. We will be welcoming in the start of the longer days. I love the light: I love the days when the sun shines. The sun seems to lift our spirits and make us feel better about life. The light shining in dark places can heal our fears. No wonder Jesus was often called 'The Light of the World'

In John's gospel, he tells his disciples

"I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

I hope you will find plenty of light in your lives this March.

#### **Funding the Church's vision**

As the church approaches our annual meeting in April, we spend some time considering the activities that we carry out and how we focus our resources on our priorities. The Diocese of Durham is focussed on three priorities: Children & Young People, Poverty and Church Growth, and much of our work in Brancepeth, beyond the basics of providing church services and pastoral care, is targeted in these areas. This includes providing Messy Church, Youth Group and Sunday School, supporting Durham Food Bank, the Children's Society and other charitable organisations, and opening up the church for concerts, conferences, meetings and events, and, of course, this newsletter.

We also support the Diocese of Durham financially by paying our parish share. People often ask what this is for, and this contribution, at £27,000 this year, represents a little over half of our annual expenditure, so it's a fair question to raise. To answer it, Bishop Paul recently wrote to all churches in the diocese to thank us for our contribution and to explain how the money is spent. To summarise, the main element of funding is spent on ministry. All stipendiary ministers are paid by the diocese (not by their parish) and the diocese also supports schools, youth ministry and the diocesan office. However, following changes in how diocesan funding works, the funding that Durham diocese receives from the national church is decreasing – only a quarter of its income is now provided centrally, with half its income being provided through parish shares, and at present it is running at a 5% deficit. So, as a relatively affluent parish in the North East, our contribution is increasingly important to ensuring the diocese can operate.

We are blessed in Brancepeth with a beautiful and historic church building, which both offers opportunities for use and requires maintenance and conservation. Our architects have recently surveyed the building and have indicated that there is plenty of repair work to do, which is critical to ensuring that we can continue to operate as we do. For this reason, the PCC spends a significant proportion of the remainder of its budget on maintaining the church. So in the run-up to the annual meeting, the PCC will be thinking about ways to expand how we use the church, preserving the heritage and developing the work that we currently do, and how we can raise funds to make these aspirations a reality. We would welcome ideas and support at the meeting on 28 April.

#### **Revision of St. Brandon's Electoral Roll**

Every 6 years the Electoral Roll of each Parish is revised and those on the previous roll are informed so they can reapply. St. Brandon's will be revising the Electoral Roll prior to the Annual Parochial Church Meeting to be held on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> April 2019.

In order to be included on the Electoral Roll an 'Application for Enrolment on the Church Electoral Roll of St. Brandon's' needs to be completed by 10th April 2019.

On the form a declaration is made that the applicant is:

Baptised, A layperson, Over 16 years of age

#### **AND EITHER**

A member of the Church of England (or of a Church in communion with the Church of England) and resident in the Parish.

OR

A member of the Church of England and, not being resident in the Parish, have habitually attended public worship in the six months prior to enrolment.

OR

A member in good standing of a Church (not in communion with the Church of England) which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and also declare to be a member of the Church of England and have habitually attended public worship in the parish during the period of six months prior to enrolment.

## The medieval history and archaeology of Brancepeth Castle, County Durham

Saturday 30th March 2019, 2pm-4pm

Architectural historians have tended to dismiss Brancepeth Castle as a 'sham' castle – 'operatic scenery' as Pevsner would say – due to extensive re-modelling in the 19th century. We locals know it's more than that!

Historic England have commissioned a three-month research project to look at the significant amount that still stands of the medieval building (circa 1398), and to understand what it might have looked like at different periods. The findings will be shared for the first time in this free public lecture, with an opportunity to look afterwards at the medieval cellars.


