Dear friends, *Ordinary Time.*

That might sound a little dull (nothing exciting happening), or it might sound like an invitation for a bit of 'down time' (so maybe a welcome break from too much busyness).

But it's actually a phrase with a formal meaning in the context of the Church's year. 'Ordinary Time' occurs twice each year: from the day after 'The presentation of Christ in the Temple' (Candlemas) on 2nd February through to the day before Ash Wednesday; and then from the day after Pentecost through to Advent Sunday. So we are now in the second and longest period of Ordinary Time, which always includes the whole of the months of July, August, September and October as well as bits either side. In some ways, Ordinary Time represents a welcome break from the more intense periods of the Church's year – Advent/Christmas/Epiphany and Lent/Easter. You probably know the African idea of occasionally pausing to let the soul catch up with the body when it has been travelling too fast, and perhaps Ordinary Time might operate a little like that for us.

But Ordinary Time does not need to be 'ordinary', and is actually a valuable part of the Liturgical Year. Ordinary Time celebrates "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects." In other words, it might give us opportunities to catch up, reflect, and grow in our spiritual lives. For us in the northern hemisphere, Ordinary Time of course coincides with summer and autumn when growth, fruitfulness and harvest take place all around us in gardens and fields. Maybe that is a helpful image for us during this longest season of the Church's year.

A prayer for Ordinary Time:

Lord,

You are the fullness of life, of holiness, and of joy. Fill our days and nights with the love of your wisdom, that we may bear fruit in the beauty of holiness, like a tree watered by running streams.



Safeguarding Awareness

"The care and protection of children, young people, and vulnerable adults involved in Church activities is **the responsibility of the whole Church**. Everyone who participates in the life of the Church has a role to play in promoting a Safer Church for all."

Church of England's Promoting a Safer Church

Everyone has a part to play in keeping our church safe for children, young people, and vulnerable adults. To play that part, we need to be aware of

- the risks that children, young people, and vulnerable adults might face in church contexts;
- · the signs that something is going wrong; and
- the actions we can take if we have concerns.

St Brandon's PCC therefore encourages everyone in the congregation to take a simple online tutorial that can help you understand these things.

It is particularly important for sacristans, servers, welcomers, refreshment helpers, sidespersons, and PCC members – but we encourage everyone else in the congregation to take it too.

The tutorial is the Church of England's 'C0 Safeguarding – Basic Awareness' course. It is simple and accessible, and will only take an hour or so of your time.

AUTUMN 1569 SAW BRANCEPETH AT THE CENTRE OF "THE RISING OF THE NORTH"

ADVANCE WARNING OF EVENTS BEING HELD TO MARK THIS IMPORTANT ANNIVERSARY

450 years ago, in the autumn of 1569, Brancepeth buzzed with horsemen coming and going - gentlemen and their tenants and servants from all over the north of England were gathering. Lights burned late into the night in the Castle.

So began the Rising of the North, the most significant domestic armed rebellion that Queen Elizabeth faced in her long reign – and it started here in Brancepeth.

The Archives and History Group are organising a series of events in the Castle to mark, record and share the story of this momentous uprising.

- 1. Saturday 5^{th} October A talk in the Castle about the Rising of the North and Brancepeth's part in this.
- 2. Saturday 19th October An evening of music, song, poetry and prose of the Elizabethan period.


