#### Dear friends

September is a month of fruitfulness and fresh starts! The allotments and gardens are producing fruit and vegetables in abundance, not to mention the berries adorning hedgerows and the acorns, conkers, nuts and seed keys of our many beautiful trees. We are looking forward to our first Garden Club Show in Brancepeth on 7<sup>th</sup> September and wondering what we might enter!

For many, especially young people, September also brings fresh starts: these often come because of the fruit of past efforts, which contains seeds for new growth. These days we tend to think of test or exam results as measures of fruitfulness, which enable children and young people to move on to a new school, college, university or job. But fruitfulness is also learning new skills that open up new possibilities, such as reading, swimming, driving a car, cooking, gardening, sewing, IT or engineering... None of us is too old to learn new skills, even if school days are long behind us!

In church we will especially celebrate fruitfulness and fresh starts at our Harvest Festival, on 6<sup>th</sup> October. During September we will be preparing for this, remembering all that we have been given, and all that God plans for us in the future, individually and together. Following our *Setting Sail* morning at the end of August, on Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> we will consider what St Brandon's next steps may be.

On Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> September, we welcome Janet Boyle to our morning service, representing *DASH- Durham Action for Single Housing*, a charity which St Brandon's supports each year at Harvest. She will tell us about the *DASH*'s work in our local area, a key part of which is helping people to rebuild their lives- to make a fresh start. By the way, you may also like to visit the *DASH* Market Stall in Durham City on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> September.

So in this season of fruitfulness let us also look forward to the fresh starts which September brings, both for ourselves and as we give and share with others. With all good wishes

Representatives from 9 local Charities were each presented with a cheque for £100 at Brancepeth Village Hall on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> June 2019.




