Mission Impossible?

Dear Friends

As the clocks go back and the dark evenings return, for many there is a sense of loss at this time of year. How much greater then our need to trust in the God who brings light in the darkness and hope from despair. The God who is there, however *impossible* situations may appear.

Our patron saint, Brandon, faced an impossible voyage of discovery with his tiny boat and few monks, but set sail trusting in God to guide him. I'm inspired by that as we continue to seek God's direction today through our own 'Setting Sail' process, and alongside other Anglican churches in Durham too. Recently a number of us attended a large and joyful diocesan gathering where we listened, talked, prayed and worshipped together: this was the start of a year-long process of planning together for the next five years. Much as the statistics and press may portray the Church in decline, we all came away hugely encouraged by stories of God's life and hope in churches and communities across this region.

In my first six months here I have often pondered how utterly impossible the task of rebuilding St Brandon's must have seemed, given the financial mountain to climb and numerous permissions and faculties required along the way. But those who undertook this 'mission impossible' still testify to the faithfulness of God and his strength sustaining them until the dream was realised.

On Saturday 2nd November at 7pm we will hold our annual All Souls service, at which we give thanks for those whom we have loved and lost. All are welcome to this, and we will remember your loved ones by name whether or not you can attend in person: please let Deborah Hodge know if this is the case for you. The pain of bereavement can feel an impossible burden to bear, but we trust in God's power to bring peace and comfort at such times of loss.

Another 'mission impossible' which we recall this month, is that faced by those who served their countries in two world wars and subsequent conflicts. Remembrance Sunday is on 10th November and our morning service is at 10.15am as usual, including our community Act of Remembrance at the War Memorial, with two minutes' silence at 11.00am.

As the month turns, on 1st December, we reach Advent Sunday, and give thanks for the 'mission impossible' undertaken by Jesus, to rescue our world and humanity.

Christ is the light who shines in the darkness, and the darkness has never overcome it.

May you know His light in your life this month

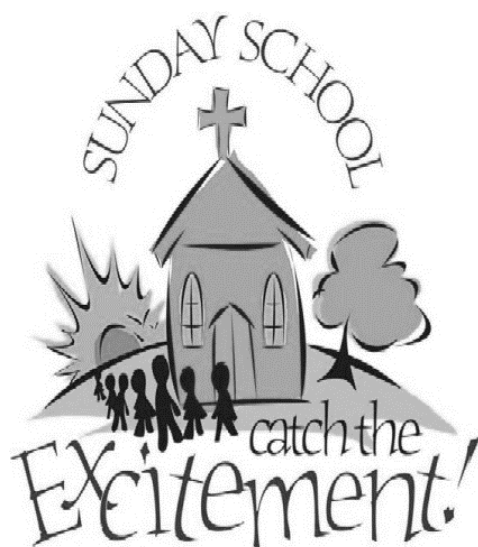

For a number of years now the people of Brancepeth and St.Brandon's have contributed to this campaign and it is always encouraging that people are keen to take part year after year. If you have been 'hooked' already, you will know how rewarding and fun it is to shop for the recommended items on the list, to try various combinations to make sure you can get all you have bought into the box, finish off with a small soft toy (for all ages and gender) and a photograph or Christmas card with a message of love and good wishes - and your donation towards transport costs. Thank you so much for all your past contributions. Perhaps I can also encourage you to ask a friend, neighbour, colleague, or other family members to join us in filling a box - every single box that is completed will bring delight and happiness to the child who receives it.

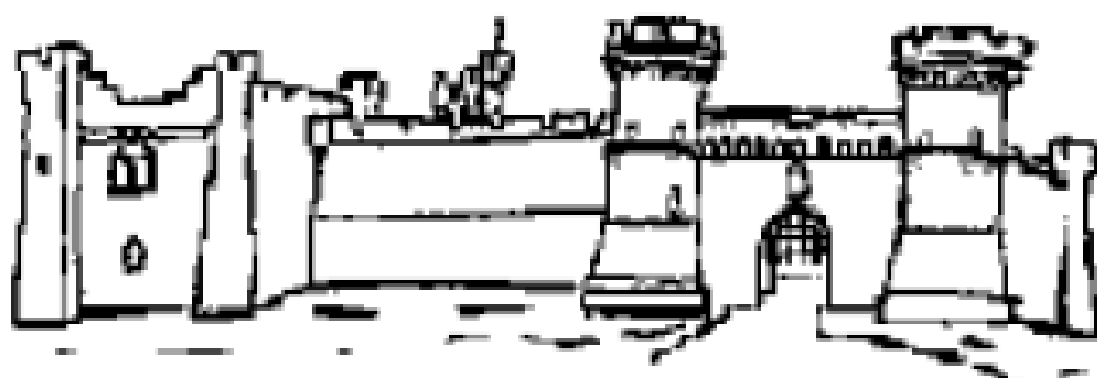

Parish Council update – ‘Adopt A Tub’

The Parish Council continue to meet monthly working towards maintaining and uplifting the amenities and appearance of this village we're fortunate to live in. We have recently improved the grassed areas around the crossroads and the postbox and provided a second set of goal posts to encourage use of the field. Following on from this we wish to improve the appearance of the villages planted tubs – the half wooden barrels. Some of these are already well looked after, brightening up the village streets; some others look a little sad. We would like to revive the ‘Adopt a Tub’ initiative with the financing of the replacement of any decayed tubs and funding a modest amount of spring bulbs and winter pansies etc. If there's an unloved tub near you, please get in touch with Dave Armstrong and get it allocated for you to plant out. A marker displaying the names of the ‘Adoptees’ – or perhaps in memory of someone – will be placed in the tub.

We are also planning with Durham County Council agencies to improve the roadside verges of the A690 in both directions out of the village, cutting back the overgrown vegetation to replant with wild flowers and giving a clear view of road signs.

Our next meeting is on Monday 11th November in the Village Hall; all are welcome. Copies of our agendas and minutes are available on the website.
