Thank you from the Shoebox Appeal

We have received this message from David Arbon the co-ordinator of the Shoebox Processing Centre for North Durham.

On 29 November, we loaded a truck with 9586 shoe boxes in 1012 cartons and these were destined for a four day journey to Belarus. A second truck came on 4 December and was loaded with 154 cartons which we had fetched from the Newcastle warehouse and the final 178 cartons (1652 boxes) from our own warehouse. This lorry was stopping off at the Liverpool warehouse to complete his load and then travelling on to Albania, a country we have never supplied with shoe boxes before.

I am immensely grateful to all those who have worked so hard to achieve this result -157 volunteers giving almost 3000 hours of their time, which is in addition to all the work that goes on throughout the year. It has been a magnificent effort and I am especially grateful to my core team and to the owner of the warehouse who lent it to us without cost.

Thank you once again for all the commitment to this amazing appeal. Over 11000 children are going to receive a Christmas present because of what you have done.

Finally, I would like to wish you a very happy Christmas and a healthy 2020

Report from the Parish Council

At the December meeting there was concern expressed by residents regarding the traffic and congestion during the recent Castle Craft Fair. After an open and constructive discussion with the Castle and Hobbs family representative it was agreed that they would consider all the concerns and propose improvements to alleviate this for the next Craft Fair.

The Parish Council are moving ahead with making improvements to the A690 roadside verges working with Durham County Council. This is to include cutting back the overgrown verges and trees, clearing pathways and making the speed limit signs more visible. DCC plan to get this work underway in January and there may be some minor traffic disruption while work is in progress.

The next Parish Council meeting is on Monday 13th January, 7:30pm in the Village Hall, all are welcome to attend.

Brancepeth Castle craft fair

We would like to apologise for the inconvenience caused by the recent craft fair, particularly to residents of The Village. We have been made aware that the heavy levels of traffic caused parking problems. It is important to us that the castle should be seen as an asset to the whole village. A huge amount of time, effort and money has gone into maintaining the building over the past 40 years as we seek to secure it for future generations. The craft fair is one of the main ways we can raise these funds, and every penny of profit is ploughed back into the upkeep. At the same time we know we have a responsibility to reduce inconvenience to the village. So we are working with a range of authorities, including the Parish Council, to look at ways in which this can best be achieved. Over the years the support and involvement of so many village people has been critical in making the castle live again, and we recognise the responsibility we have in return. The Trustees.
