

#### **Dear Friends**

Now the snow has gone (at least at the time of writing!) the bulbs are starting to spring up energetically in our garden and around the village. We have the special joy of the Merringtons' daffodils all along the drive next to the Rectory: they are looking very healthy despite recent weather!

March brings the promise of Spring as we travel toward its official start on 20<sup>th</sup>. The same day, the church remembers St Cuthbert, most especially here in Durham. It was reading a book about him – *Fire of the North* by David Adam, highly recommended- and having a holiday on the Northumberland beaches with our young family, which first drew me to the North East many years ago.

Cuthbert lived in difficult times; no stranger to harsh, solitary conditions, he was known for his rapport with wildlife, notable eider (cuddy) ducks and the otters which reputedly dried his feet after his night time prayers, said standing thigh-deep in the North Sea! Perhaps there are resonances for us after this long, tough winter. Certainly the birds in our garden have become friends, a daily reminder of the wider created world we share.

Cuthbert was often called on to bring wisdom and grace in the monasteries and local communities where he served, at Melrose, Ripon and finally Lindisfarne. His gentle, steadfast trust in God somehow enabled those who disagreed violently to find reconciliation I find Cuthbert an inspiration as I seek to live wisely and at peace with others, especially those with whom I disagree.

This prayer of blessing says much about how Cuthbert lived, and traditionally is used on St Cuthbert's Day in Durham Cathedral:

Go in peace, with God to enfold you:

God in your speaking, God in your thinking, God in your sleeping, God in your waking, God in your watching, God in your hoping, God in your life, God on your lips, God in your heart, and God in your eternity. Amen.
