

Dear friends

Varied and constant birdsong; happy chatter from busy allotments; the hum of a distant lawnmower; passing traffic on the A690... these are my sounds of summer in Brancepeth! I'm pleased to say that another sound will soon return- the ringing of the bells of St Brandon's.

Listen out, not only on Sunday mornings before the service, but also for evening practices and peals, as the Durham University bell ringers return to practise, along with our village ringers. BY the way, more local ringers are always welcome- contact James Morgan for more details. There may also be bells as weddings are celebrated in the coming months, after none being possible last year.

During June we will be holding the first of several baptisms this summer, as we welcome babies and children into the family of the church. That's another much-loved sound: children in and around St Brandon's. I'm so grateful to our Sunday School team, who always have activities prepared each week, and to the Messy Church team who are planning a Treasure Hunt and picnic in the churchyard later this month.

All this contrasts starkly and tragically with what we hear in the news. The sounds of war and terror in the middle east; of fear and desperation on European coasts as migrants arrive; of sorrow and anger as the pandemic continues to rage across India and elsewhere. We can only pray, campaign, give and not close our ears to the cries of others.

A special thank you, therefore, to everyone who gave generously to this year's Christian Aid Week, whether online or via the house-to-house collection. Their work addresses emergency needs and long- term development, and they campaign for justice, climate action and peace. Christian Aid Week may be past, but the work goes on, so in closing I commend this Christian Aid prayer to you:

Great God,
Who makes the sun to rise, and opens the heavens,
Hear the cry of the people
Who sow in hope for rain, but reap only despair.
Hear the cry of the people
Seeking shelter from the storm, their hopes and homes submerged.
Hear the cry of the people,

Music and worship at St Brandon's: looking to the future

The last fifteen months have taxed to the limit our abilities as a church to provide Sunday services. We are so grateful to all those who have made it possible for us not to miss a single Sunday since 22 March last year, when we first ventured into the realm of virtual services. From wholly Zoom services during the lockdowns to blended services at other times that have brought together people in the church building and at home, we have worked hard to sustain the community within our congregation.

Of course, worship would not be worship without music. We are hugely grateful to the Gooding/Farquhar family, who have provided us with hymns from day one, first live from their own home, then recorded faithfully week by week, and more recently live in church. Alongside them, Richard Hird has recorded organ voluntaries for us and has been able to play the organ in services over the last few weeks, Jean Merrington has blessed us with beautifully judged piano music to close online services, Alison Moore and Wilfred Foxe have offered sensitive instrumental interludes, and Tom and Ulli Hobbs have brought us singing from the Castle. We thank them all!

The constraints of worshipping under lockdowns and in blended services have been an opportunity to experiment with different forms of music in worship, and we are now looking at how we can develop our use of music to draw on the best of our long-standing traditions and the innovations of recent months. A few weeks ago we asked the congregation their opinion on what they have enjoyed and what they would like to see in the future.

Unsurprisingly, there was a wide range of opinion! A few people regret having fewer old traditional hymns accompanied by the church organ, and would like to go back to that sort of worship more regularly. At the other end of the scale, a few people were in favour of moving to more modern forms of worship. But the vast majority of the people who replied said how much they have enjoyed the variety of forms of music that we have used in the last 18 months, and that they would very much like to see that continue as we move back towards more 'normal' services. We are very grateful to everyone who responded to the survey. PCC will now be discussing future plans, and we hope that you enjoy the musical offerings over the coming months.

A tribute to Jane Waugh who will be laid to rest in the Circle of Remembrance

on Sunday June 13th 2021

Jane, Douglas and Katherine Waugh lived at Corner House during the 1970s and 1980s and those who lived in the village at that time may remember seeing Jane out every day walking with daughter Katherine and Bip the dog.

Jane and Doug transformed Corner House (the old estate reading room) from an uninhabitable wreck, with no plumbing and mushrooms growing in the kitchen, into a family home.

Jane was active in village life, she served as clerk to the Russell Trust for many years and then helped with the church Sunday School and the village toddler group as Katherine grew up.

Katherine and James Morgan were born within three weeks of each other and have remained good friends despite the Waughs moving away, first to Burnham and then Richmond, North Yorkshire. When Jane sadly died last year it was not possible to have more than a simple funeral so June 13th will be an opportunity for family and friends to celebrate her life in a place she always loved.

CASTLE: ROOFING AND WINDOW REPAIRS

You may be wondering what's happening at the castle under the big white tent: are we building some grand extension? No, but it is an exciting project: many of you will have been in the central room known as the Ballroom or Great Hall, perhaps for a wedding dance, or an exhibition, and some may have seen the enormous domed stairwell and double stair behind the closed arch?

Thanks to a big Heritage Stimulus grant from the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport, in conjunction with Historic England, we are reroofing this whole area and renovating the impressive, 4m diameter bronze skylight. The skylight had been shrouded in tarpaulins for the last twenty years so it will be wonderful to see daylight shining on the stair again, something Margaret would never have believed possible.

Margaret would also have been thrilled to see the new windows installed in the Billiard Room, designed by local glass artist Mike Davis, a long standing friend of hers. The room itself is the new home for the Brancepeth Archive, which she helped found as the BHAG, and now sunny, rich colours greatly enhance the whole experience of the room for them. The repair and renovation of these windows and those in the adjacent Constable Tower (used for art and craft exhibitions amongst other things), was grant funded by Historic England through the covid recovery fund.


