

Dear friends

Do you know the old joke about church lighting?

How many PCC members does it take to change a light bulb? Answer: Change??!!

Thankfully at St Brandon's there has been and is a positive attitude towards change as a necessary part of life, whether forced upon us through fire or pandemic, or emerging more gently with the seasons of our lives. The past 18 months have brought unforeseen changes for us all, but thankfully some of them positive, in terms of better communication and connections with each other.

It's in this spirit of 'can do' that I hope we can approach the biggest challenge and need to change which the world has ever faced. I write this on the day following the publication of the UN Report on Climate Change. Our news screens, recently full of COVID- related images and graphs, are now showing wildfires, floods and graphs of rising global temperatures. As we take on board the reality and severity of the situation, it is easy to despair or give up. But if we change, so can the future outlook for our children and grandchildren, our local and global neighbours. And if we seek God's help to do this, we draw on the power and love of the Creator, which are greater than we can ask or imagine.

St Brandon's has recently become a 'bronze award 'Eco Church: we will work towards silver and gold in the coming months. In doing this we will listen and learn, discuss and pray about how we can care for creation and safeguard the climate, right here and now. In the next few weeks there are two focal points:

September 19th, **Harvest Thanksgiving**, celebrated in the Parish Eucharist at 10.15am and Messy Church at 3pm. Let's gather as a community to give thanks for the beauty and fruitfulness of our area and to commit ourselves to caring and sharing, with generosity and determination.

Saturday and Sunday 2nd and 3rd October, Brancepeth Climate Weekend

We are planning events open to all, to raise awareness and share stories and activities which will help us *embrace* needful change rather than resist it, which is our default, of course!

On Sunday 3rd in the morning service we have a guest speaker from *A Rocha UK*, a national and worldwide Christian environmental charity- do take a look at their website: arocha.org.uk,

from which this prayer by Ray Simpson is taken:

Creator, make us co-workers with you,
that the earth and all who live upon it may reap a full harvest.
Show us how to reflect your rhythms in our life and work
and to conserve the world's rich resources.
Help us to give all creatures their due respect,
to tend cattle and crops with care.
Guide science along wise and considerate ways,
that we may fashion agriculture that truly enhances,
and that we may sustain a vibrant environment.
Amen.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

We have applied to the County Council to designate the whole parish as a neighbourhood area. This will involve producing a Neighbourhood Plan (NP) which will give us a greater say in any future developments that affect the parish. Over the course of the coming months we will be consulting with groups and societies within the parish about the NP but we need your help to get started.

This is an opportunity for residents of all backgrounds and ages to have a say about what already exists in Brancepeth and what might be missing. It will be developed from your ideas whether they relate to historic buildings, green spaces, community facilities, transport or something else entirely. It is important that the plan caters for the needs of future as well as current generations so we want to hear from children and young people as well as adults, those who live in the village itself and those who live outside of it, those who have lived here for many years and those who are relative newcomers, those with large families and those living on their own or as couples, those in full-time or part-time employment and those who are retired.

Knit and Natter

The Knit and Natter group will be meeting in the Village Hall on September 14th and 28th and October 12th and 26th.

Brancepeth Community Association (BCA) Update

It is good news to report that the Village Hall has **fully reopened** following changes to social distancing rules. Some of the regular user groups have started to resume their weekly activities (including yoga, snooker, and badminton) and others have confirmed that they will recommence after the school summer holiday period, followed by the return of the weekly Wednesday Coffee morning from mid-September onwards. There have already been a number of ad-hoc bookings from members to celebrate life events with their family and friends and the hall booking calendar is starting to fill up with future bookings – all of which is very positive!

To make the hall as safe as possible, there are Covid-19 guidance posters situated throughout the building (updated to comply with government guidance for the safe reopening of community buildings) and there will continue to be a supply of cleaning products, hand sanitisers and paper towels.

During the various lockdown periods – when the building had to close – several investment initiatives were implemented including replacing the aged stair lift, refurbished and improved stage area including a new overhead storage area with safety rails, new star backcloth, stage curtains and new LED stage spotlights. Also repairs to the chimney stacks and some electrical works have been completed as well as the installation of a phone booster for increased phone signal in and around the building.

We hope that members will make good use of the building and its facilities going forward ...

The BCA has a new website where you will find information about the weekly and monthly hall user groups, ad-hoc social events, and how to make hall bookings (including information about the various facilities on offer): www.brancepethcommunityassociation.co.uk

You may recall that the BCA annual membership subscriptions were put on hold – due to the on/off closure of the building. As you know, the annual subscriptions are a significant part of the BCA's income and help with the upkeep and maintenance of the building as well as helping to facilitate hall users with social, recreational and educational activities at subsidised rates. Due to the closures, the subscription year will now commence on 1st September 2021 (and last 12 months to the end of August 2022), thus giving members 18-months extended membership during 2020/21. The annual grant from the BPC also helps with the building's annual running costs.

Fortunately, the BCA bank balance remains healthy with Covid grant support from the Government. A sub-group has been formed to review options for a significant green project – to invest the monies in the long-term sustainability of the building and make it more energy efficient.

Lastly, to let you know, the BCA committee has recently changed with a few of our long serving committee members retiring from the committee. With thanks to Joan Taylor, Josie Armstrong, Margot Harrison and Peter Aitken – all of whom contributed a significant amount of their time to improving the building and facilitating many great social events and activities – they will be missed! Val Gibbons has now joined the committee and there is another vacancy.
