

Dear Friends

Last month Anna wrote about the 'recycled cathedral' builder, Justo Gallego Martinez, who had died at the age of 96. Continuing the theme, this month it seemed that I could do no other than to celebrate the life of Archbishop Desmond Tutu, who died on Boxing Day aged 90.

He came to international prominence when he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1984, and he became the key spokesman for the oppressed black majority in apartheid South Africa – the voice of the voiceless – both as Bishop of Johannesburg (1984), and then as Archbishop of Cape Town (1986). In 1987 he visited Durham, preached in the Cathedral against apartheid and Maggie Thatcher's government's policy against imposing economic sanctions (David Jenkins was Bishop), and was made an Honorary Freeman of the City.


Nelson Mandela was released in 1990, allowing Desmond Tutu to step back from being

a political spokesperson. But he was then asked to chair the Truth and Reconciliation Commission in 1995, probably the pinnacle of his lifelong quest for truth, justice and reconciliation.

But beyond racial justice, he was also a champion for the rights of women, the LGBTQ community, and human rights more generally.

And, of course, all of this was motivated by his Christian faith. He was described by another bishop as a "pastor and prophet in close integration, undergirded by a remarkable ministry of intercessory prayer".

And besides all that, we probably remember him too for his great sense of humour – almost as though he danced his way through life. One



commentator described this as an "irrepressible gaiety that kept bubbling up from the inexhaustible well-spring of the Spirit within. Never had the Lord Jesus a less solemn witness to the gospel of the resurrection"!

What a remarkable man. And perhaps one not just to admire, but to seek to imitate.

The Reverend Jean Mayland RIP




It is with sadness that we have learned of the death in December of Jean Mayland at her nursing home in Hexham, aged 85 years.

Jean and her husband, the Reverend Canon Ralph Mayland, came to St.Brandon's in 1994 when Ralph took up the post of Honorary Curate after retiring from his position as Canon Treasurer of York Minister.

Jean had just been appointed to the Durham Diocese as Ecumenical officer. Throughout her life she strenuously campaigned for diversity and inclusivity within the Church; she was a patron and trustee of Changing Attitude, working for the full inclusion of the LGBTI+ community into the life and ministry of the Church of England.

Although Jean and Ralph were only in Brancepeth for a short time before retiring to Hexham, it turned out to be a hugely significant time for her. In 1979 Jean had become a founder member of the Movement for the Ordination of Women and was in the forefront of pioneering the issue for many years. She was seen as a prophetic, fierce yet gentle advocate for justice. It seems that large numbers of women, ordained and lay, became who they are because of Jean's strength, challenge and deep faith.

In 1994 the Church of England finally accepted the ordination of women. It was during her time here and with the sponsorship of St.Brandon's, that Jean was one of the first cohort of women to be ordained priests in Durham Cathedral in May 1994, by the Bishop of Durham, the Rt.Revd.David Jenkins.



As this picture shows, her first Eucharist was celebrated here at St.Brandon's - the eagle eyed amongst you will spot the familiar candlesticks - and it was indeed a historical day.

Her dear husband Ralph died in 2020 and we send our condolences to their daughters Sarah and Alex, and granddaughters Lauren, Rachel and Isabel.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Our meetings

The last meeting of the Parish Council took place on Monday 17th January 2022. Minutes will be available in due course on the PC website. The following is a summary of some of the main issues that were discussed. The next meeting of the Parish Council will be at 7:30pm on Monday 21 February 2022.

Appointment of a Councillor

We were delighted to welcome Phil Davison to the Parish Council. Phil lived in Brancepeth Village for many years and, after a period away, is now living in The Forge. His co-option means that we have now reached our full complement of seven councillors.

Cricket Field and Allotments

Draft leases have now been sent to Castle Estates and we are hopeful that these will be signed and returned in the not too distant future. Meanwhile we have agreed the purchase of sturdy goal posts for the field. One or two of the trees in the field, close to the wall, are causing concern and will be part of an overall survey of trees in the village.

Neighbourhood Plan

We are continuing to make progress. Prior to the PC meeting, our working group held an informal meeting with Fraser Tinsley, Local Councillor for Willington and Hunwick, on neighbourhood planning. This was extremely helpful. We have now identified four or five key objectives for the Neighbourhood Plan and residents will be consulted on each of these in due course. Our next step is to apply to DCC for the funding that we are entitled to.

Road Safety

We have been unable to take further action on road safety as we are still waiting for a report from the Traffic Assets team leader at County Hall providing the costs of measures previously proposed to improve road safety in the village.

Platinum Jubilee

We agreed that we would like to continue the Parish Council tradition of planting a tree to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen.
