

Dear Brancepethians,

It's that time of year. The weather is cooling down, the nights are drawing in and the leaves are starting to fall off the trees. It's easy to start to feel despondent. Maybe time to find a bit of thankfulness.

And today, as I write I am feeling thankful. In fact, I am feeling very thankful.

About forty-eight hours ago I finished running the London Marathon. You'd be lucky if you hadn't heard me banging on about it for the last six months. It was my first (and last!) attempt, and I am no spring chicken.

So, on the day, I was thankful for those family members who had got me to the right place at the right time, for the organizers for their amazing efficiency, for the volunteers who were unwavering in their smiles and enthusiasm, for the weather that was glorious in spite of a dire forecast and for God giving me the strength of body and soul in order to complete the task.

But I had a charity place and I am especially thankful to the wonderful people of Brancepeth who have donated so generously to my charity and who kept asking how my training was going. What on earth will we talk about now?

You raised the amazing sum of **£2,647** for **The Children's Society**. That's about 32% more than my target.

Thank you so much. You have helped in transforming the hopes and happiness of young people facing abuse, exploitation and neglect. Mile by mile and pound by pound we have helped to give hope to disadvantaged young people and to give them a safer happier childhood.

Now I'm thankful that I can have a bit of a rest!

However, as I look ahead to November, I see that there are a number of occasions in that month when it would be good to pause for a moment and to give thanks.

The first of these is 1st November, which is All Saints Day in the Christian calendar. It is a day to honour and to be thankful for the men and women who the church has chosen to be canonised or made a saint. Men and women who by their lives, by their witness, by their writings, by their words or sometimes even by their deaths have shown the love of the Lord Jesus and the ways of God.

The second one follows on rapidly by being the next day. All Souls Day is on 2 November. It is a day designed to focus on and to be thankful for on those people in our lives who we dearly loved but have now died. Of course, there are many ways to do this and they are not only for this day but St Brandon's does offer a special service when you can come to church and reflect on those loved ones and if it is your wish, names can be read out or you can light a candle. You would be so welcome.

And the last of my special thanksgiving days is November 11, Armistice Day or Remembrance Day. It marks the end of World War 1 in 1918 and now includes those who have died in any conflict. We give thanks for those who gave their lives for our freedom and for our future. We may mark that thankfulness by buying and wearing a poppy and again St Brandon's will make the occasion including the two minutes silence. Again, you would be very welcome, even if you don't come to church regularly.
