

Giving... thanks

A highlight of Christmas as a child was seeing presents appear under the tree, checking labels, squeezing and shaking as I tried to guess the contents. One of the best gifts I remember was from a family friend: a set of poster paints in little jars, which I treasured for years. But I also remember the frustration on Boxing Day when told not to start painting yet: I had to write a thank you letter first!

Being made to say 'thank you' is a good training for life, however dutiful or formulaic the words used. For when we don't say thank you, we risk becoming arrogant, self-centred or rude, becoming less than fully human, in fact. I've just been interrupted in writing this by a colleague who phoned to say 'thank you' for help offered during a challenging time in her ministry and am touched that she made time to do this.

Thanksgiving is mentioned countless times in the Bible, especially in the psalms, which capture so much of life's ups and downs. Psalm 100 says *enter his gates with thanksgiving*, and Psalm 50 tells us *offer to God a sacrifice of thanksgiving*. Jeremy Taylor advises

From David learn to give thanks for everything. Every furrow in the book of Psalms is sown with the seeds of thanksgiving.

This isn't only about saying thank you, but about our whole approach to God, others and all of life.

In this season of giving and receiving, let's consciously practise gratitude, not just for the gifts we may receive but for the many everyday blessings we enjoy. As we sow the seeds of thanksgiving in our homes, families, church and community, so we'll see new shoots of encouragement and generosity begin to grow...

Talking of generosity, please remember the yellow food bank at the back of church: let's try to fill it regularly to support local families in these harsh economic times. Please also support the Salvation Army in Langley Moor with their Christmas Present appeal on Sunday 4th Dec- details in this newsletter. Thank you.

And as we approach Christmas with thankful hearts, may we appreciate and welcome afresh the greatest gift of all, the baby born to be our Saviour. We will have many opportunities to gather and give thanks for the birth of Jesus in the next few weeks, including the Christingle Service on Sunday 11th December and the Carol Service a week later on 18th. Details of Christmas services are in the enclosed card: you are welcome to them all.

With all good wishes for a happy and thankful Christmas and for God's blessing now and in the New Year.

CHMMUNITY of the WELL

I wonder if the first image that comes to your mind is that this is something related to being 'well' versus being 'un-well'? Or something to do with a well for water?

Both are correct to some extent: the title was inspired by the bible story about the Samaritan woman who offers Jesus a drink of water when they encounter each other at a well, and in particular, a wonderful sculpture depicting this image at Chester Cathedral. The aim of this new venture has many parallels with that story, the outcome of which was that the Samaritan woman was made 'well' by the encounter: 'wellness' is a whole body/mind/spirit state.

At the moment, the Community of the Well comprises four persons: Alison Hobbs, Deborah Hodge, Julia MacDonald and Judith Minto, who have been in prayer and conversation about this for a few years. We have now reached the stage where the diocese are formally recognising the venture by licensing (literally, 'permitting') Alison to operate in the role of 'Director of the Community of the Well' alongside being 'Associate Minister at St Brandon's'. This is necessary because the Community of the Well will operate with a Christian message under the Church of England's banner, so recognition and compliance naturally have to go hand-in-hand. It is also necessary because it is an independent venture based at the castle, alongside but not part of, St Brandon's.

Since September 2018 we have been opening the castle chapel for worship on weekdays, and increasing the awareness of visitors to opportunities for quiet and spiritual encounter that the chapel and other spaces offer. We can host a small number of residential guests, or larger groups for shorter periods, providing prayerful spaces or activities for peoples' own encounters with one another, with themselves, with God; for an hour, a day or a week. Particularly, we see creative, hands-on activities, and spiritual development as potential offerings. Most of all, we aim to bring God's blessing to, and be blessed by, what evolves here.

County Durham Foodbank

As always many thanks for your donations to the foodbank.

The Count Durham Foodbank has recently seen a month-by-month increase in the numbers needing support. The cost of living payments for those on benefits, and the energy payments are helping. Without those payments, the numbers needing the foodbank would have increased dramatically. However, there are now more working families coming who can no longer make their finances balance. As they are not on benefits, they don't receive the cost of living payments.

Although people are still being incredibly generous, donations are not growing in line with demand, which means that the Foodbank is having to purchase wholesale items running low. From the 1-3 December the Foodbank is having their Christmas food collection at seven of the large Tescos: Annfield Plain, Bishop Auckland, Consett, Chester-Le-Street, Durham Gilesgate, Langley Moor, Newton Aycliffe.

They need as many volunteers as possible to support these collections in two hour shifts. When volunteers are present to collect the donations, we are advised that they collect three times more food than if they're unmanned. If you, or any friends, could help out for a couple of hours, that would make a huge difference. It would be really good if some people from Brancepeth could contact Lindsey (*Tel no. 0191 303 8623 or email <u>lindsey@durhamcp.org.uk</u>*) in the foodbank office and let her know the date(s), store and times that you can help.
