Dear friends,

I think of January as a time of space, quiet, stillness, and light: thin, cold but increasing light. A pause for taking breath after the clamour of Christmas and before the demands start up again. We don't seem to get much opportunity for being quiet in our frenetic, news orientated world so it's a change to take time just to look and think. I learnt in primary school that the name of the month is taken from Janus, the Roman god who looks in two directions at once.

I wonder if you are more of a looking backwards person: going back through what 2022 contained, and evaluating what you would like to remember or repeat, and what you want never to have to experience again?

Or are you a determined forward looking person: filling in the new diary and ruminating on the plans and hopes for what 2023 will offer?

I find it much easier to do one than the other but the richest route is to glean from the findings of last year, what we would most like to build on and explore in this year; what we need to recover from and what we want to build on that will enrich our lives.

I remember one Brancepeth friend describing how they ritually review the year past as a New Year's eve sharing with close friends, having considered ahead what 'my favourite ...', 'my best ...', 'my happiest ...' 'the worst ...' were, in the agreed categories. Whether, or not, this informed their direction for the year ahead, I have no idea.

Identifying what brings us alive, stretches and grows us, is not selfish because who and how we are, rubs off on those around us. It is difficult though, to be honest with ourselves, avoiding making comparison and competing with others, and accepting who we really are. It's helpful when we can draw on a loving God, dare to believe we are loved and lovable and that being truer to who He made us is all that is asked of us: managing increasingly to be our 'best selves'. For me, this is the work of January; for you, perhaps it's on long summer days?

Whichever way you are made, I wish you good adventures and explorations as you stand poised on the turn of the year and plunge into living 2023 at your best.

I will be at St Beunos, N Wales all January and the first ten days of February doing the Spiritual Exercises of St Ignatius of Loyola which is a sort of pilgrimage but the journey requires you to travel into your

relationship with Jesus rather than along a physical road – and I have no idea where it will lead me!

We are pilgrims on a journey, fellow trav'llers on the road: we are here to help each other walk the mile and bear the load.

At Alison Hobbs' joyful Licensing Service on 11 December, we sang these words and thought about the Community of the Well and its aim to offer help and encouragement to everyone who's exploring spirituality and faith. The Bishop preached about John the Baptist, who questioned who Jesus was and whether he'd got his own message wrong; and he noted that Jesus didn't criticise or judge John for these doubts and questions, but instead gave him encouragement and compliments just when he needed them. And this Spring St Brandon's will be offering *Pilgrim*, a small group course where we explore what Christian faith is all about – including our doubts and questions.
