#### Easter is for everyone!

Lent is the forerunner but not the qualifier: when Easter bursts, it showers its blessings on everyone, believers and unbelievers, every faith and none, because it is the One universal God that breaks out of death into life, to bring new life to everyone.

Not everyone wants to hear that, not everyone will believe that, but not even that excludes you from the offer because the invitation is to everyone, regardless. The invitation being to turn towards love, dare ask the God who is love to guide you in the little choices and actions of each day, to make you more courageous in consciously choosing life and love, over the deathliness of despondency and despair.

Organised religion gets a very poor press these days with lurking suspicions of 'brain-washing', narrow-mindedness, and much else, yet the reverse is the lived experience. Jesus came to set us free from what narrows our vision, and to give us the tools to make healthy decisions for ourselves, and spot the traps and pitfalls life throws at us. When we want to expand our understanding, the most effective way is to do it alongside others, accessing the most knowledgeable and reliable teachings, sharing and celebrating our findings. That's the provision and function of church, in its broadest sense.

Lent may not be the qualifier for Easter – the invitation is there whether or not you have kept Lent – but the forty days of preparation are the opportunity to deepen our knowledge and love of God, and awareness of His love for us. We are so self-centred that it's natural for us to assume that we are the initiators: we start to notice and love God, and He begins to love us back. No, it's totally the reverse: He already loves us despite our attitude towards Him; He loves us completely, that is, He couldn't love us more even if we .... whatever. But, as with any relationship, we become involved in the relationship and changed by it, only if we participate in it. It's only when we feel the stirrings of interest in this love He has for us that we begin to tap into the new life. Lent is about us stirring up and building up our love for Him, in preparation for the big celebration of New Life that is the Easter promise.

May you be built up this Lent, and blessed this Easter, Alison Hobbs

A member of the Church of England (or of a Church in communion with the Church of England) and resident in the Parish.

OR

A member of the Church of England and, not being resident in the Parish, have habitually attended public worship in the six months prior to enrolment.

OR

A member in good standing of a Church (not in communion with the Church of England) which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and also declare to be a member of the Church of England and have habitually attended public worship in the parish during the period of six months prior to enrolment.

#### **Brancepeth Parish Council**



**Neighbourhood Plan:** We continue to hold consultations with local groups, and we are updating the draft with a view to plan a public consultation in May 2023.

**The Field:** As of March 2<sup>nd</sup> 2023 the field has been listed as an Asset of Community Value, this is a big step and results in our being aware and given a chance to purchase the field should it be placed on the market. This will be listed for 5 years.

We held an extraordinary meeting on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> March regarding the expiry of the field lease and the licence to occupy offered by Castle Estates. Thank you to those that came along. Residents expressed various concerns and were given the opportunity to ask questions of the Parish Council. It was confirmed that the Parish Council had instructed their lawyer in July 2022 to make enquiries with the Landlords lawyer as to whether they were willing to extend the current lease and the request had been denied. In response to further questions, it was confirmed that the offer was short term and there would be a significant increase in the cost.

The Parish Council resolved to appoint the Land Agent that came back with a quote, this would include negotiations for a new a lease or purchase and valuation of the land.

**Village speeding:** We are pleased that the traffic survey taken in January this year shows that overall speeding has reduced along the A690 with over a 50% drop in vehicles travelling at 36-40mph.

Brancepeth in Bloom: The Chair has invited residents and representatives from local groups to join a small working group to meet on an ad hoc basis to continue long term planting. We are expecting our first round of judging for Northumberland in Bloom in late April. Please do not feel that there needs to be an urgent push to make our parish look like a RHS exhibition space! We are looking to contact Durham Council with a shortlist of items we would like them to improve including the pathway in front of the field and the path heading out of the village to Stockley Grove.

**Council News:** Councillor M Coffield tended her resignation on 27 February 2023, on behalf of the Parish Council, the Chair thanked her for her contribution and acknowledged her contribution to the Parish Council's priorities over the two years as Vice Chair.
