

## Dear friends,

## God save the King!

I don't remember the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II, though I do remember parents' memories of it, including my father in law, who camped out in a London Park, one of thousands of servicemen and women who lined the streets for the Coronation Procession. He never forgot it...

After the joy of last year's Platinum Jubilee and the sorrow of the Queen's death and funeral, it may be hard to rouse ourselves to mark this historic occasion. At its heart, beyond the pageantry and parties, lies a solemn service in Westminster Abbey, where the King will be prayed for, anointed and make oaths to *serve* the nation, with the help of God. The ring, sceptre, rod, orb and crown which he will receive all bear a cross, a powerful reminder of Jesus Christ, the Servant King, On top of the rod there is also a dove, symbolising the Holy Spirit. Since the coronation of Charles I in 1625, this prayer has been sung as each monarch is crowned, a translation of the Latin *Veni creator spiritus* by John Cosin, Bishop of Durham and Rector of Brancepeth:

Come, Holy Ghost, our souls inspire,

Anoint and cheer our

soiled face

And lighten with celestial fire. With the abundance of

they grace:

Thou the anointing Spirit art, Keep far our foes, give peace

at home:

Who dost thy seven-fold gifts impart. Where thou art guide, no

ill can come.

Please do join me and others at the Village Hall on 6<sup>th</sup> May to watch the Coronation together, and at church on 7<sup>th</sup> May to mark this occasion with music and prayer. Above all, please pray for King Charles II that he may rule humbly and wisely, for the good of all and in service of God.

#### Partnership in Missional Church - PMC

This first year of PMC is all about listening. Gathering information and stories and views from a range of people and sources helps us to see ourselves more clearly. And this all helps us to see where God is at work. Here's a brief update on where we have got to:

- The 'Timeline Event' captured reminiscences of St Brandon's over the decades.
- Graphs, stats and figures have given us data about church life over the past ten years (membership, congregation numbers, finances . . .)
- A variety of kind people with links with the church took part in 'structured conversations', answering thought-provoking questions. We await the report that will summarise these anonymised interviews.
- A different variety of kind people from various community groups in the parish have had conversations with us about shared aims and concerns.
- Other stats and figures have revealed aspects of our geographical and community neighbourhood.

**Sunday May 21**<sup>st</sup> **Morning Service** will focus on PMC. We look forward to seeing you there and sharing reflections on what we're learning.

## **Climate Action Group**

Here's an update on where St Brandon's has got to in relation to climate action since the three climate-themed Sundays we held around Harvest last year.

The most noticeable item is the new cycle rack adjacent to the new churchyard. We hope this will be of use not only to visitors, a number of whom come by bike, but also to more regular members of the congregation. Maybe it will even encourage more people to cycle to Church!

Where that's not possible, walking is the most environmentally friendly option of course. And car-sharing – both when coming to Church and more generally – is also something worth doing. Might that work for you?

You may also have noticed that we have joined the 'toilet twinning' scheme run by Tearfund. You will find pictures of toilets in Malawi and Zambia now in our Church loos. USPG, one of the charities we support regularly, has strong links with Africa including programmes in these two countries – so it seemed good to mark the link (see <u>United Society Partners in the Gospel | Central Africa (uspg.org.uk)</u>.

The PCC has also agreed to offset our carbon emissions, i.e. 'pay' for the carbon we emit. We're doing this via Climate Stewards, part of the A Rocha group (see <u>About Us - Climate Stewards</u>). A Rocha is one of our regular charities and runs Eco Church, where we already hold the Bronze level award (see the plaque in the porch).

We recognise that our aim should be to decarbonise our emissions entirely, so that carbon offsetting ought to be only an interim 'solution'. Decarbonising isn't straightforward since, although we already use 'green' electricity for power and lighting, most of our emissions are associated with the gas-fired heating system.

St Brandon's took part in a Church of England / Durham University project which looked at decarbonising churches. In our case, the proposed solutions were electric – radiant heaters, storage heaters or air source heat pumps. Each of these, however, would require a larger electricity supply than we currently have, so there would in total be quite a significant capital cost.

For the time being, the PCC has decided to wait until it becomes clearer which of the technologies would be best – but recognising that we will need to replace our gas boilers probably around 2030.

Finally, we have decided to sign up to another A Rocha initiative -\_Churches Count on Nature. This is an annual scheme where people record the plant and animal species they find in their Churchyard. It runs from 3-11 June, and we need a couple of volunteers to help with this survey. So, if you're around then and would be interested please do let me know.
