Dear Readers,

I feel that I might have got the short straw in having to write the Newsletter letter for June. What happens in June?

May seemed to get more of its fair share of goodies-two religious festivals-Pentecost and Ascension Day; three Bank Holidays and a coronation. What not to like?

Of course, there are a few Saints days in June, e.g., Barnabus, Peter and Paul but what else? My friend Mr Google tells me that in June I could, amongst other suggestions, celebrate World Oceans Day, World Giraffe Day and guess what- Sausage Roll Day.

So, I'm going to change tack and write about something that is not a celebration and to ask for your help.

Apparently, food and drink prices rose by 20% in the 12 months up till March. That means your weekly shop has gone up by an average of £12. I do most of my food shopping online and so, apart from occasionally thinking that the total does seem quite a lot, I don't give it too much thought. But I know that I am the lucky one. Even my 18-year-old student grandson is constantly complaining how much the price of cheese has gone up and he's only been a student for 8 months. For many families this is a real struggle. And of course, it's not just food prices that have risen.

The Trussell Trust was founded in 1997 to improve conditions for children sleeping in Sofia Central Railway Station in Bulgaria. Its first food bank in the UK opened in Salisbury in 2000. Hardly a city most of us would associate with deprivation but maybe proves how widespread is the problem. In 2006 the trust distributed 2,814 food parcels. In the last 12 months it has distributed almost 3 million from its 1,200 centres.

The Trussell Trust It is based on, shaped and guided by Christian principles. In Matthew's Gospel, chapter 25 Jesus tells his followers a parable about sheep and goats; animals that can look very similar. In this story Jesus says that those who feed the hungry (and do many other good deeds) will enter his kingdom.

At St Brandon's, we have tried to follow that Christian principle of helping those in need. We have a lovely bright yellow bin that is based at the back of church, and we encourage both members of the congregation and those who live in the village to put a gift in it and, if possible, to do so regularly. There is a printed list saying what the bank would like but we particularly home in on long-life milk and fruit juice. David and I regularly take the contents to the weekly foodbank in Brandon. From there it goes to the centre in Chester le Street for distribution.

There are many reasons why people find themselves in food poverty, mostly not their own fault. "I've worked all my life and never thought I'd be in the situation where I'd need a foodbank" said one user.

A big thank you to those who regularly donate to our yellow bin. If you don't maybe you could think about it; it doesn't have to be a big donation, every little helps.

So maybe we could together make June (and every month) very special.



The concert will feature stirring choruses, passionate love duets and popular arias from Falstaff, Rigoletto, Aida, La Traviata, Otello and II Trovator



This event is important because a Neighbourhood Plan (NP) gives a community the opportunity to define how their local area should grow and change. Future planning applications will be judged against the NP as well other relevant statutory plans. From the Parish Council's stakeholder discussions and surveys so far, we think we have a clear idea about parishioners' priorities, and so we have produced a **draft NP* for Brancepeth**.

Before we finalise the NP, you now have the chance to comment

Please drop in on the 14th to see some **displays** and a short **presentation** (delivered in both time slots) which will explain how the NP will help to shape the development of the Parish. We shall also precis the full NP into a **Summary Leaflet** for your convenience. You can discuss our plans with us during the Event and have your say over a cup of coffee.

We'll invite you to complete a Feedback Form in which you can share your thoughts on the suggested policies. Alternatively, you can simply give your comments via a note in the Suggestion Box in the Hall, or scribble something on a 'post-it' note for our 'Graffiti Wall' on the day. If you don't have time to do this on the 14th, please take the Form home and return via the Village Hall post box, or to 24 Goodwell Lea, or 3 Foxes Row.

We look forward to seeing you there, but if you cannot attend, then please download a hard copy of the Form from our website^{*} and return as above. If printing your own copy is not possible then contact Nick Ellis on <u>n.t.ellis@durham.ac.uk</u> or 0191 378 2939.


