Lest we forget

I write this the day after the tragic destruction of the AI -Ahli Arab hospital in Gaza City, in which many hundreds lost their lives. Yet today's focus of news is the apportioning of blame for the attack, rather than help for the victims. You may have heard the BBC interview with Richard Sewell, Dean of St George's College in Jerusalem. When asked 'What can you do to help?', his answer was this: 'We are praying for the situation and the people, for their sustenance and their courage...' Let us never overlook the imperative to pray as our first response, the heart's cry of pain, outrage, bewilderment and shock. When there is nothing we can do, in human terms, we can *pray*, and we must pray. These images, and those seen less frequently now from Ukraine, will impact how we approach Remembrance Sunday on 12th November.

I will also be recalling our visit to Gallipoli, famous for the bloody and futile First World War campaign in which thousands died, on a narrow strip of land, whose proximity to the Dardanelles Straits had long made it attractive to invading armies. We went, in part, to remember a relation who died there, as well as two others, relatives of friends. Thus, one sunbathed April evening, we sought and found all three names on the huge Hellas Memorial at the tip of the peninsula, its Portland stone gleaming pale against the blue of sea and sky. Panel upon panel of names convey the enormity of loss. And the next day we visited the largest Turkish memorial, which holds as many names again.

Gallipoli today is a place of eerie peace and beauty, locked in time since its designation as a UN National Park and Protected Area, with no industrial or tourist development. Preparations were being made for the commemoration of Anzac Day, when young people from across Turkey come to stay overnight near the beach, holding a dawn service to recall the invasion and its response.

What surprised me most was the lack of blame attributed to the British and Commonwealth invaders, though their distant commanders, safe on a Greek island, were rightly criticized. Visitors are afforded a warm welcome, shown the sites without bias, but rather with the hope of ensuring we do not forget. How tragic it is each time that hope is dashed, and how vital that our children, like their Turkish peers, hear, remember and seek to break cycles of violence in their own generation.

Please do join us on Remembrance Sunday at St Brandon's, and do bring children, grandchildren and younger friends and neighbours with you. With every year the need to remember grows, and for me the awareness that the God of Love, who died for the sins of the whole world, weeps with all his children in the midst of tragedy and destruction. Let us remember and let us pray.

St Brandon's Partnership for Missional Church (PMC)

Part 1 of the three year project known as PMC (Partnership for Missional Church) is drawing to a close. Facilitated by the Diocese, we have carried out a number of tasks to help us get a realistic sense of our story, and what we are like as a church. It has been all about listening. We have gathered information, stories and views from a range of people and sources to help us see ourselves more clearly — and to see where God is at work. The Parish Eucharist on **Sunday 19**November will focus on our progress so far. With our tables and chairs set café style, we'll first discern God's guidance by "Dwelling in the Word", with interactive engagement during the morning's sermon. The Core Team will briefly summarise the data gleaned about our church life over the last 10 years, backed up by information sheets, booklets and display boards. This will be followed by a report of what we have heard during our interviews with members of the congregation and our local community. But it won't all be one way — there'll be plenty of opportunity for discussion! We look forward to seeing you there and sharing reflections on what we have been learning.

Alan Hubert Nugent 08.02.1942 - 01.09.2023

The Brancepeth Years 1985 – 1994

The role of Priest-in-Charge at St. Brandon's church in Brancepeth was linked to the role of Durham Diocesan Director of Education in the 70s and 80s. So when the then Lord Bishop of Durham, David Jenkins, appointed Alan Nugent to this post in early 1985, he moved here with Wendy, Meredith and Rhidian to take up residence in the Rectory and become Priest-in-Charge in the village. I think it is fair to say that he was thrown in at the deep end. 1985 marked the nine hundredth anniversary of the known church in the village (subsequent events proved that in fact Christian worship on the site pre-dated 1085 by several centuries) and it was inevitable that the village priest would take a central role.

It soon became clear that Alan relished this opportunity. While his democratic style of leadership was in marked contrast to the more dictatorial style of his predecessor (and this contrast was not welcomed by all members of the congregation) he was able to make his mark and led the celebrations with aplomb. And this set the tone for his tenure here with all the family throwing themselves into village events. Obviously, his church ministry took centre stage in his priestly activities but his pastoral ministry to both church-goers and non-church-goers was much in evidence.

In September 1986 Alan organised a weekend away at the Diocesan retreat centre at Brotherswater in the Lake District for any families wishing to go. I am unable to recall numbers but it was hugely popular and cemented many family friendships in the village. I have recently been given a copy of a contemporaneous report of the weekend and it is clear that we had a hilarious (and exhausting) time. Never one to fight shy of an opportunity to appear on stage, Alan was a stalwart of the village Christmas shows. His performance as one of Gilbert and Sullivan's 'Three Little Maids' was unforgettable.

By 1994 there was so much educational legislation being enacted that the joint role so ably filled by Alan for nine years was untenable and thus he and Wendy left Brancepeth to live in Durham for a short period before his move to Lincolnshire.

On a personal note Alan and I developed a firm friendship based upon our mutual love of fell walking in the Lake District. Our conversations on these outings ranged from the intellectual to the banal but were always stimulating. What must it have been like to be a member of the French resistance during the war? (The Band on the way up to Bow Fell). The trivialisation of the news that round-the-clock news services made inevitable. (Blencathra). At the time of the TV series 'Queer as Folk' did an actor have to be gay to play the part of a homosexual? (Robinson on the way up to Dale Head). And perhaps most importantly in the development of my own Christian faith – who is God and what is heaven? (Great Gable). That I can so clearly remember these conversations and where they occurred is perhaps my greatest tribute to Alan.
