Dear friends,

Mungo the Merciful

I write this on the day when the church remembers St. Kentigern, better known as Mungo, a Celtic Christian leader in the 6th century. I discovered that his nickname Mungo means 'darling' and read the legend which gave rise to the presence of a salmon on the civic coat of arms of Glasgow, whose cathedral is dedicated to St Mungo. Who knew?

In case, like me, you didn't, here is the story. Kentigern – Mungo- was offering pastoral support to an unfaithful but contrite queen, who had given the king's ring to her lover. The king, on discovering the queen's liaison, had thrown the ring into the sea and demanded that she find it in three days, or face his wrath. As Kentigern sat with her and prayed, one of his monks arrived, bearing a freshly caught salmon, inside which was the ring!

Make of that story what you will, it is refreshingly hopeful. Compassion and forgiveness are more powerful than anger and hatred; the seemingly impossible is not beyond the reach of God' mercy. And prayer makes a difference!

Our little prayer team at St Brandon's regularly and quietly prays for people in need and for situations which feel impossible. Visitors to church leave prayer requests in the Neville Chapel, others contact Alison Moore, who circulates these to the team confidentially. It is a privilege to bring requests to God in prayer, and we see many answers, sometimes in unexpected and amazing ways, other times in steady, almost imperceptible change and growth. Alison's details are later in this newsletter- do contact her, Alison Hobbs or me, if you'd like us to pray for a specific need, or if you'd like to join the prayer team.

As we embark on Lent this month, and look out for the first signs of spring, let's not rule out the seemingly impossible, but continue to pray and work for peace, justice and mercy in our lives and world. And as you savour a salmon steak or smoked salmon sandwich this month, remember Kentigern, whose compassion made him Mungo, beloved by his people, because he never stopped believing in the amazing, joyful mercy of God.

Partnership for Missional Church – PMC

St Brandon's is now into the second half of the PMC process. The Core Team shared the findings of the first half at a Sunday service in November. The challenge at the end of 2023 was to decide on what to focus on this year - something that fitted with what we'd discovered, but didn't have an obvious solution. So, over the next few months we are following two strands:

Firstly, paying attention to the focus we identified – "How can we meet and connect generously with all who are newer to our village and church?" We guess that this is a challenge for all village groups, as well as individuals, and we look forward to learning from others and sharing ideas. You may yourself be 'newer', or recently arrived in church or village, and have good (or less good!) experience to contribute to the discussion. Don't be shy – let us know what you think!

Secondly, getting used to the habits, or practices, that have been introduced through this PMC process. So far, we have encountered: Dwelling in the Word (a very different way of engaging with scripture and listening to each other); Belonging in our Communities (being real about the context of St Brandon's); Seeking God's way together (a method of paying attention to where God may be leading, with everyone gathered together); Hospitality (less *offering* hospitality and more being open to *receiving* it from others – ie 'upside down' hospitality).

January update following Parish Council Meeting Monday 15th January:

Litter Pick - we plan to run our first litter pick of the year **Saturday 10th February**. Please meet at the Castle Gates at 10am with refreshment at the village hall from 11am. Equipment provided and all welcome.

Neighbourhood Plan - the working group has met with the County Council's Spatial Policy Officer for advice on the current plan. Following this they are preparing a final draft which will be published for the public to view in due course.

Christmas Tree - the Parish Council has committed to exploring options for a permanent fixture to allow safe electric supply for the Christmas Tree lights at the cross roads. We are enquiring into grants available to support this cost.

Cricket Field - we still have no response from Castle Estates in reply to our proposal to negotiate a renewal to our lease or possible purchase. Our offer remains on the table and we are prepared to continue negotiations in good faith.

Northumbria in Bloom & Beautiful Durham - following our success in 2023 we have again entered Brancepeth in the aforementioned initiatives. Look out for further information to support our entry in the coming months.
