Radical Hope

Are you feeling *hopeful* now that April's here? It's a hopeful month for many, especially those blessed to live in this beautiful area, as longer, warmer days arrive. *Hope* may often be seasonal or temporary, based on looking forward to events and celebrations, all positive. Thus, I was struck recently by the phrase *radical hope*, which promises something deeper and more lasting.

The word 'radical' has become linked to extremism, in reference to faith and politics especially.

But its true meaning is about depth: roots, as gardeners know well, are vital to life and growth. We have personal roots in the community where we were brought up or now belong, we talk about 'grass roots' organisations where interests and purpose are shared. This is about common goals and values, which bring shared hope.

The Easter message of hope is as radical as it gets. Jesus, God incarnate, 'one of us', is unjustly tried, executed and buried, then defeats our greatest enemy death, and returns to life, with many witnesses. Easter brings us eternal salvation and shows God's power to overthrow evil, reverse injustice and bring deep hope for today and the future.

As people made in God's image, I believe we can all play our part in living out radical hope, personally and as a community. Here are three practical suggestions:

- Get involved in our 'grass roots' groups here in Brancepeth. There are plenty to choose from and they all build hopeful, supportive relationships which improve everyone's lives.
- Support organisations working to bring radical hope where there is injustice, poverty, or violence. St. Brandon's seeks to be a local hub for this, e.g. the year-round food bank or Christian Aid Week (12-18 May). I know many of you are actively involved in this way.
- Be informed and use your votes this year, in local elections on 2 May and the general election, whenever that may be.

May God bring us radical hope in our lives and community, this month and beyond. With best wishes,



Following Bishop Paul's retirement, the Vacancy in See committee, which guides the diocesan part of the appointment process, is now beginning work in earnest to prepare for the appointment of the next Bishop of Durham. This timetable is set nationally, and we have until mid-April to discern what should be included within the diocesan statement of needs which describes what the diocese is looking for in our next Diocesan Bishop. We would like to hear your views and we have launched an online consultation which can be found using the link below:

https://bit.ly/DurhamVacancyInSeeConsultation

This is publicly available on the diocesan website, along with a page explaining the process and who is involved, and the consultation will be open until 3 April 2024, just after Easter. We would like the responses to be as representative of our diocese as possible, so please share this link with your PCCs, congregations and communities and encourage them to have their say. The poster and QR code attached can also be used to reach the consultation page, and can be printed for display on church noticeboards. We appreciate that time is relatively short, and this online survey is one of many approaches that we are taking to hear a representative range of views from the diocese. For those in our congregations who may wish to complete the survey but find it difficult to access an online survey, the survey can be printed and responses posted to Cuthbert House.

We are developing diocesan prayers for use in parishes during the vacancy which will be available soon and there will be an opportunity to join together for a day of prayer later in the year. Further details to come. In the meantime, please hold the discernment process and the Vacancy in See committee in your prayers. THE CHURCH ELECTORAL ROLL - What's it all about?

The annual review of St.Brandon's Electoral Roll is due, and the up to date information will be reported to the Annual Parochial Church Meeting on Sunday 28th April.

The Electoral Roll is a parish church's register of electors. In the same way that being on the civic Electoral roll allows you to vote in parliamentary and local elections, joining the church electoral roll means that you can vote on church matters, attend the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) and stand for election to the Parochial Church Council (PCC). If you consider yourself to be a 'regular' at St.Brandon's, then you should also consider being on the electoral roll!

You can join the Electoral Roll if:

- You are aged 16 or over
- You are baptised.
- You are a member of the Church of England (or of a Church in communion with the Church of England*) and
- · EITHER live in the ecclesiastical parish of St.Brandon's
- OR if you live outside the parish, you have attended the church regularly for at least 6 months.

The application form and declaration will also provide more details regarding eligibility*, and will need to be completed by the **13**th **April 2024.**

If you are already on the Electoral Roll of St. Brandon's you do not have to do anything further..... but if your contact details have changed in the last twelve months, it would be really helpful if you would let me know.

Brancepeth in Bloom Again

After the host of prizes we won last year, we have entered for the Northumbria in Bloom competition 2024.

The Brancepeth in Bloom (BiB) working party have been working to prepare for this year's judging with the main aim of uplifting our Silver Awards to Gold for the Village and the Churchyard and consolidating the Golds won by the Allotments, Golf Club, and a private garden (last year Annette Johnson's).

Only 40% of the marks go to the actual horticulture category so we do not need to be expert gardeners. The remaining marks are split between Environment and Community. Last year, we scored very highly on the last one.

The judges assess us twice a year. Our first 2024 visit will be in the morning of **Thursday 18th April**. The planned route will include the daffodil laden roadside to Stockley Grove by car and then a walk through the village from the Wolsingham Road entry box to the Church.

We have a lot to do after this long and very wet winter to tidy up the village so it looks again like Beautiful Brancepeth. We will also be addressing some items the judges raised last year.

Consequently, we are arranging a Village Tidy Up during the weekend of **6th/7th April**. Look out for the notices in the Noticeboard and round the village for details. If you have other queries, call Hassall (378 1295) or Richard (378 3271) and we will be able to help.

Any time/help you can give, will be very much appreciated.


