Dear Friends,

Did you see the Northern Echo's post last month (3 April), headlined 'Picturesque County Durham village named among poshest places to live in the UK'? It was referring to the Telegraph's list, ranking the country's 48 poshest villages. The accompanying photograph to illustrate this was, predictably, the church and castle set amongst gorgeous parkland (golf course), the village nestled adjacent. Brancepeth got the same accolade in 2023 and 2022. Last year was Brancepeth's first entry in the "In Bloom" competition which secured several silver and gold awards. Mmmm, is that how we see ourselves? Poshest? Prettiest?

Speaking from the perspective of a castle-dweller, it may not surprise you that, despite outward appearances, neither of those two adjectives fit my definitions. It certainly is a privilege to live in the castle, with fabulous architecture and wonderful views but if you are a fan of comfortable living, and a la mode décor, it is definitely passé. However, what is always new and renewing, are the people. Those who come as visitors, whether it is simply to look or enjoy a coffee, or whether they are hosting or taking part in an event, they bring the building alive, and make it theirs for the day. Many relate to something here and go away taking something intangible with them, sometimes that brings them back, and they build on the sense of belonging.

It is a peculiarly 'personal' castle; that surely must originate with, and emanate from, those who have bravely or romantically made it their home. Castle residents are from a broad range of backgrounds and ages, some reside for a few months but most are long-term and settled. It is the warmth of relationships across this community of residents that creates the heart of the castle and makes the greatest difference to the enjoyment of living here.

We are not unique at the castle in enjoying this quality of community, it is replicated in different ways all through the village of Brancepeth. It is a village that is both 'alive' and has a 'heart'.

Usually when referring to the heart of a village it would mean a particular building or facility. The village hall, church and golf club form three such centres. We have an amazing two-dozen fitness, leisure, and learning activity groups operating from the village hall, and a lively church frequently thanked for being so welcoming. In themselves, they could add up to an excellent selling point if we were looking to commend the facilities to a prospective buyer. But I would like to suggest that the true heart of Brancepeth is fostered through the links people make across and in these different activities.

If you were to draw a circle for each Brancepeth activity group and put the names of each person within the circle, and then arrange the circles so each person's name only appears once (this is called a venn diagram) there would be an awful lot of overlap: a lot of people span several groups. Add in other informal activities like dog-walking, and neighbourliness, and we see a network that forges strong links right across the community.

By and large, these links rooted in common interests create an awareness, respect, and compassion for the well-being of the other, and lead to a genuinely caring community. This is what I would say is the value of Brancepeth, it is precious beyond measure, and it has nothing to do with being posh or picturesque.




