

Dear Friends,

Once upon a time, a group who lived in a nice (posh) village, met together for a purpose. Not everyone was familiar with each person present, so the convener suggested that they went round in a circle giving their names and saying one thing about themselves. The first one to speak said 'My name is...... and I have lived in the village for (big number) years. The second person followed suit and gave their name and how long (more big numbers) they had lived in the village. And so it continued. The last members of the group to speak said, 'my name is and I've lived in the village for 8 days'. Not a very encouraging welcome for the newcomers.

Sadly, that story is mainly true. Readers, that was us. I know because my husband and I were the ones who hadn't even unpacked all our removal boxes. Fortunately, I can't remember who was there and I'm sure the intentions of the old timers were good even if they lacked a bit of imagination and forethought. I am now amazed to think that that meeting took place 27 years ago. But, in truth, despite feeling a bit saddened by my story I also recognise that making people feel welcome isn't always straight forward or easy; nor is trying to fit into a well-established community.

Last month, Alison wrote about our village, which apparently has been defined in the press as one of the 48 poshest villages in the UK. I'm sure we'd all agree with her that being posh and picturesque, is not what really counts but what matters is that it is 'alive' and has 'a heart'.

One of the ways that we can see the life and heart of the village in action is through its groups. For a small village, Brancepeth has an amazing number and variety of activities going on. However, many of these groups have failed to maintain their numbers post pandemic. I suppose folk got used to having to stay at home and others missed out on the opportunity to be welcomed as a newcomer. A problem shared with many communities across the UK I suspect.

As a church, St Brandon's has recently been focussing on how we could welcome newcomers better. But we also thought we could learn from other groups about their issues and how they might be dealing with them. We certainly don't claim to have all the answers, but they say that two heads are better than one so we have decided to host an event where people from different groups can share their concerns and hopes together.

What this means in practice, is we will hold an event/meeting/social in the village hall on **Friday 14 of June**. A couple of people from each of the village activity groups will be invited and for 90 minutes have the opportunity to share with and listen to others, while we enjoy some refreshments. We have no idea where this will lead except we hope that it might encourage and support what Alison called our 'genuinely caring community'.

If you are one of those people coming, I look forward to seeing you there. If not please spare a thought or a prayer for us on that evening. Please talk to your group leader and tell them your thoughts.

It's Brancepeth and whether you are an old hand or a newby you are always welcome.

Walking in our Neighbourhood:

- Those who live in each house you pass (you don't have to be on foot!)
- · Local businesses, shops, leisure facilities and all who use them
- Transport and service providers e.g police, healthcare, as you see vehicles go by.

Walking around the World:

- As you hear, read or see news, pray for that place and situation.
- If you go on holiday, pray as you enjoy other cultures and experiences.
- Recall places you've visited and turn memories into prayers of thanksgiving, supplication and hope.

Durham Singers Concert – 29th June

The Durham Singers present their summer concert 'Fauré and His Pupils' to celebrate the centenary of the composer's death, and his legacy, on Saturday 29 June 2024, 7.30pm, at St Brandon's Church, Brancepeth, Durham. Gabriel Fauré (1845–1924) is highly regarded as a French organist, composer and teacher, working at the Paris Conservatoire, and at the famous Madeleine church in the city.

Our programme includes a well-known song by Fauré's teacher Saint-Saëns 'Les fleurs et les arbres', Fauré's own 'Cantique de Jean Racine' and his pupil Nadia Boulanger's 'Cantique'. Choral pieces by pupils Ravel (arr. Tarney) and Roger-Ducasse, and Franck's 'Prélude, fugue et variation' (organ soloist, Adam Heron) follow.

The evening culminates in a performance of Fauré's *Requiem*; the choir is joined by Laura Oldfield for the soprano solo in 'Pie Jesu'. We celebrate the lasting effect of a composer who was, in his time, considered radical and modernist and whose unique voice in French composition has continued throughout the twentieth and into the twenty-first century.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Parish Council's May Annual Meeting was held on the 20th May.

The Chair, Hassall Balshen stood down from the position, thanking his colleagues and the clerk for their support and assistance during his 3 years in office, and explaining that he felt that while the position of Chair shouldn't be "rotated" each year; that 3 years was a long enough term for him, and that it was now time for a fresh approach. The new Chair is Mike Lowe, and Tom Hobbs is Vice Chair.

The Parish Council also was pleased to co-opt a new Councillor, Catherine Stevenson. Her breadth of experience and her enthusiasm for the Brancepeth community makes her a most valuable new asset to the PC.

The meeting received a report from Richard Jackson on the progress being made by the "Bloom" group, and in particular, the "Tile Mural" project for the bus shelter – it looks really impressive, and should be complete and in place very soon.

A meeting with a Neighbourhood Planning consultant is being arranged for early June, and next steps should be clearer after that.

June's Messy Church is all about Fruit- of the Spirit!
