Dear Friends,

Exactly one year ago, I wrote in one of these letters about what was going on in the life of St Brandon's. I noted that, since the retirement of Anna Brooker as our priest-in-charge back in October 2024, the church had been 'in vacancy', and I predicted that the vacancy might last a while. I was hoping, of course, that events would prove me wrong – but it is now one year later, and the vacancy is, for the time being, still open.

We are working closely with colleagues from Durham Diocese, who run the advertising and appointment processes for us, and we are confident that we will find the right person soon, but for the present we are still looking.

Most of the time, however, you could be forgiven for not noticing the vacancy. Our services, our special events, our engagement with the local community, our work with charities — all of it carries on, much as usual. And we are able to carry on with all of this because we can rely upon so many volunteers. From the newsletter editor to the team that livestreams some of our services, from the flower guild to the food bank collection team, from the churchyard maintenance team to the home visitors, and from our social media guru to the person who wrangles the donkey for our Palm Sunday procession, volunteering is the engine that powers our life together.

That's not just true of the church, of course. It is true of our village life as a whole, and it is true much more broadly than that too. From the local level to the national, our life together can't be reduced to the items that are bought and sold, or the activities undertaken for profit or paid for by taxation. We all rely, often far more than we realise, upon people who give their energy and commitment for free, and for the common good. Surrounding the economy measured by interest rates and GDP, there is a wider economy powered by giving and gratitude, where the fundamental currency is people's time. The life of St Brandon's is just one place where that economy becomes visible — and one of the silver linings in this time of vacancy is that our dependence upon each other's generosity is made even clearer than normal. Our life together simply would not be sustainable without it — and we are deeply grateful to all the many within the church and in the surrounding community who contribute so freely.

Happy New Year to all. I hope 2026 brings good things for everyone. Thank you for renewing your membership - and a warm welcome to new members. Your support is vital in helping us maintain the village's community building.

The Village Hall has been well used over the past year hosting groups, activities, social events, and welcoming new hirers. Thank you to all BCA sections, local groups, members, and everyone involved in our social events for making active use of the facility. I'd particularly like to highlight the **Wednesday Coffee Morning**, which continues to offer a warm and welcoming space for people to meet. Please do join us for a chat, a hot drink, and delicious home-baked treats generously provided by volunteers. Their hard work is greatly appreciated.

The BCA Management Committee has also been working hard to keep the building in good repair and to address the administrative workload associated with the building's licences, insurance, and charity compliance. Some key efforts this year have included:

- Continuing our energy-efficiency investment plan with further electrical upgrades, including installing PIR energy-saving light sensors in the Ladies' and Gents' toilets and the hallway.
- Repurposing the stage storage cupboard to provide much-needed space for BCA sections to store equipment.
- Improving the audio set-up by having the ability to link the fixed stage speaker to the mixing deck, removing the need for the heavy, outdated portable speakers.
- Hosting food-safety training and certification for BCA volunteers and other village groups and updating related procedures and documentation to reflect changing regulations.
- Repairs to the chairlift and a replacement disabled handrail.
- Undertaking significant pruning and ivy removal in the Hall's copse area with thanks to Jim Merrington for supervising this work.
- Reviewing our energy contracts in response to rising costs and securing best-value charity rates.

Looking ahead, the Committee will continue to prioritise energy-efficiency improvements throughout the coming year to help offset rising utility costs. We are grateful to the Parish Council for its annual grant, which makes a valuable contribution towards significant running expenses.

The BCA Management Committee is currently stretched, and we would very much welcome new members. If you're interested in getting involved and supporting the running of the Hall, please do get in touch.

Finally, a heartfelt thank-you to everyone who contributes to the success of the Hall. Your efforts make an enormous difference. **Martyn Jones, BCA Chair**
